Club programs include early childhood education, hot lunch, after school, evening, summer, homework club, youth choices program, health and wellness, and life skills.. Upgrades are needed in technology, art and music facilities. There is a new memorial garden in memory of members who have died. There is a fundraising dinner April 5<sup>th</sup>. The capital campaign has a goal of \$750,000 for playground equipment, the learning centre, gym renovations, passenger van, technology infrastructure, building needs, and energy improvements. The question and answer period included mention of several Club alumni/ae who have gone on to do well in universities and careers. In

thanking the speaker, Bob Capson apologized for the small turnout, and suggested members use their contacts to bring businesses on board for the capital campaign.
