Monthly Meeting February 21st, 2018

We stood for a minute of silence in memory of *Lester Mott*, long time PROBUS member. President Ed mentioned he had presented the Mott family with Lester's PROBUS name tag.

Secretary **Willard Buckley** asked for approval of the Minutes of the January 17th, 2018 meeting, as issued in "*THE PHOGHORN*", pending any errors or omissions. There being none, Fenton Keirstead made motion for approval, seconded by Gordon Dempsey, passed by the membership.


Don LeBlanc intoducted our guest speaker this month, **Keith Dow**, who is also a PROBUS member.


Gordon Dempesy presenting a *Probus Anniversary Cup* to *Keith Dow* for his presentation on the "Acadians".
