### Call to order 10:00 am September 18, 2019

<u>Minutes of last meeting</u> – a motion to accept the minutes as published in **The Phoghorn** e-mail was made by **George McCaughey** and seconded by **Gordon Dempsey**.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – *Robert Taylor* is away. *Don LeBlanc* suggested we wait for his return to receive the Treasurer's Report at our next meeting in October.

<u>Membership – Guests</u> – **Dale Stevens** introduced **John Watson**. John had retired from The **Irving Oil Refinery** and is a member of **The Shriners**. **Gordon Dempsey** introduced **Allan Donaldson** who was a **Judge in British Columbia**. Allan is a golfer, likes cars and has a Jaguar XKE.

<u>Snippets by David Goss</u> – Bill Covert read several passages from David's book – September 18, 1904 visitors came to Saint John to visit Reversing Falls, Seaside Park, Martello Tower, The Cathedral and Trinity Church. September 21, 1983 Calp's Department Store celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. They employed over 100 people. Ten years later the store closed for good March 1993. Don LeBlanc spoke about Loyalist House where he and Chip Lawton volunteer as guides along with several others. Additional volunteers are needed especially during multiple cruise ship days.

Lunch Count – Twenty people indicated they would stay for the lunch of Lasagna and Caesar Salad.

<u>Upcoming Programs</u> – John Doyle has arranged Jay McLean of YOGA HOUSE for October, Jim Quinn, Port of Saint John for November followed by the String Quartet in December. John brought up the possibility of a tour of Moosehead Brewery. This appears to be a popular idea. Twenty-five indicated they would attend. A fee of \$15.00 per person is applicable. We could possibly go November 6 or 13. Tom Craig made a motion, seconded by Ron Lister that members pay their own way which was passed. It was felt that the tour should not conflict with our regular meeting dates. John is to firm up the details.

Chip Lawton introduced our speaker for this month, Mr. Derrick Stanford, the CEO of the Saint John Airport.

The *S.J. Airport* is a non-profit organization with a 14-member Board of Directors. The airport received its first Government assistance this year to help with modernizing the runways, which are the most modern in Canada for an airport of its size.

The airport has 17 flights per day. Sixty-five per cent of the business is business travelers. The Airport has two main runways, 5000 feet and 7200 feet. New LED lighting will improve service and allow handling during some adverse conditions.

All parking areas as well as the lounge areas have been renovated.

The Airport has WIFI and several private commercial hangers. Thirteen jets are housed at The Airport. The Airport will develop a Commercial Park in the future. The Airport has an APP where you can check on flights and arrange to have a taxi.

Derrick was thanked by John Johnson and presented with a PROBUS 25-year anniversary Mug.

The meeting adjourned for lunch. Next meeting is October 16th, 2019 at 10:00 am


