April 25, 2022

Call to Order - 10:04 – **Don LeBlanc**, President, opened the meeting with the singing of **O Canada**. Twenty-seven members were in attendance.

Member Updates: It is reported that **David Flewelling** was not well; **Peter Jolly** was doing well in Chateau Champlain and that **Frank Setchell** was resigning from the Group due to health issues. The President acknowledged that **Jim Shillington** was in attendance following an extended absence.

Minutes of last meeting - The March minutes were included in the Phoghorn which was emailed to members. On the motion by **Gordon Dempsey** and seconded by **Robert Taylor**, a motion to accept the minutes as was passed.

Business arising – Nothing presented.

Treasurer Report - **Robert Taylor** indicated that there was approximately \$720 on hand He indicated that a more detailed report would be forthcoming in May.

Presentation – The guest Speaker for the day was **Dr. Sarah Gander, Pediatrician**, who is the former Clinical and Academic Head of Pediatrics in Saint John. Along with other members of the Department she co-founded the New Brunswick Social Pediatrics Research Program in 2017. She advised that the Clinic operates out of a site on Princess Street and that they have created an Outdoor Clinic Space where Program participants may participate in the Program activities. She indicated that Program is involved with several community organizations that aim to provide better care to families and children living with difficult situations, especially poverty. She spoke about the various Programs offered by the Program and indicated that one of the things they worked at doing was to enable women living in poverty and on income assistance to transition into the work force. She advised that her Program connects with the schools in the area to provide need services to those in need. She advised that her Group would be hosting a Gala Event on November 18 at the Cruise Terminal. She was introduced by **Don Mitchener** and thanked by **Brian Mitchell**.

New Brunswick Social Pediatrics

In late 2017, the NB Social Pediatrics Research Program was launched with funding from Saint John Regional Hospital Foundation. In less than 5 years, we have grown our team from one research coordinator and clinical lead to a large network of staff, clinical partners, students, community service providers, volunteers, and families. We have also created a charity partner organization to help serve over 300 patients and clients, while the demand for services continues to grow.

Children in New Brunswick are slipping through the cracks. Child literacy rates in New Brunswick are among the lowest in Canada (StatsCan, 2004), while the child poverty rates are among the highest (SJHDC, 2017). Children in New Brunswick who aren't keeping up academically are facing much more complex and pervasive issues like unsafe and inadequate housing, food insecurity, as well as neglect, abuse, and the lack of a social support network.






